Club Administration / Foundation

This year the club supported the District Assembly with a number of board members attending the assembly in Adelaide.

The club continued with fortnightly meetings and the club bulletins informed members of the activities and guest speakers' programs were produced on a timely basis.

We supported the Rotary Foundation by actively participating in the fundraising and contributed to our charity of choice and a further amount to the End Polio program.

Youth

During the year our involvement with the young people in our area saw the club:

- Sponsoring an award at the annual Berri Regional Secondary College Speech night.
- Providing prizes for the annual Berri Swimming Club Championships.
- Supporting School based Apprenticeships and Traineeships



Whilst our activities for youth have been limited due to the lack of fundraising, we have reestablished links with Berri Regional Secondary College promoting our various Youth programs. We plan to continue working with the school to have more students involved in our Rotary Youth Programs in the future.

Membership

We started the year with nine members and finished the year with nine members.

We were fortunate to induct two new members, Vicky Andriske and Belinda Thompson-Wilkinson early in the year. Unfortunately, Belinda resigned due to work pressures.

The club continued with our "Friends of Rotary" category supporting our projects without the commitment of Rotary. We are grateful for the support that we get from our Friends who turn up when there is a need.

Vocational

The Riverland and Mallee Vocational Awards were held at the Berri Hotel on Friday night 10th February with nearly 250 attending. This major event was organized with the help of many supporters both financially and in kind, and they should be congratulated for their continued support.

Hugo Kregar was awarded the 2022 Apprentice of the Year and the 2022 CITB Building & Construction Award.



Hugo follows in the footsteps of many young talented Apprentices as the 2022 Riverland Apprentice of the Year.

Other winners on the night included:

The successful night was largely due to the high calibre of finalists and genuine support of sponsors.

Service Projects – Local and International



During 2022-2023, we supported the community by using our BBQ trailer at no cost in partnership with Radio 5RM who provide the free Easter breakfast for us to cook and the 5RM staff serve the community with the Breakfast.

Members of the Club also cooked a sausage sizzle at Santa's Cave working with the Berri Our Town committee. We also worked with the committee at the Our Town Wellbeing Sausage sizzle in January.





President Peter through his contacts at local schools has been able to collect significant quantities of second-hand schoolbooks and taken them to Adelaide to be sent overseas through the South Pacific School Aid project.



The club was represented at the Riverland Field Days with a Shelterbox promotional display in September.



Donation of an old format ShelterBox tent and equipment was made to the Berri Special Guides Unit in September from the Rotary Club of Berri and ShelterBox Australia. During the year the club joined in a project with the Lions Club of Berri and provided Solar panels for the Berri Men's shed to

cover future electricity bills. That project attracted a Rotary District grant of \$2,226 which was matched by the Berri Rotary Club, the Berri Lions club also matched the total amount contributed by Rotary.



Fundraising

The Club continues to raise funds through the battery collection.



An amount of \$2,596.00 was raised at a Charity Baseball event which is scheduled to be invested in seating for patrons at future Baseball games.





The club members also assisted with catering at the State Baseball championships and Riverland Softball finals.

Our club continues to hold a Hat Day event to raise funds for Australian Rotary Health mental health program.

Treasury

The Rotary Club commitments made during the year towards fundraising and community projects were less than in previous years as well as the decision of the Board to place further emphasis on fellowship and take account the limitations of club members in performing tasks due to employment etc.

Several social and vocational visits were planned during the year.


